Open water swimming

Open Water Swimming takes place in outdoor bodies of water such as open oceans, lakes, and rivers. The beginning of the modern age of open water swimming is sometimes taken to be May 3, 1810, when Lord Byron swam several miles to cross the Hellespont (now known as the Dardanelles) from Europe to Asia. In the first edition of the modern Olympic Games in Athens in 1896, the swimming competition was held in open water. In 2000, the Olympic Games first included a triathlon with a 1500 m swim leg, and in 2008, a 10 km open water swim.

Venue description

Larnaca Nautical Club was officially founded in 1951 and was initially practising the sailing sport. However, the roots of the Club go back to 1934, when sailing started in Larnaca. At that time, the Larchak, the late Pavlos Rossidis, designed a small sailingboat. The boat named Mersina was built by the well-known shipbuilder Dimitros Skeparidis.


Other similar boats were built and races began to take place in the Larnaca Bay. In 1936 official competitions started.

Today the club has athletic sports teams competing in swimming, water polo, sailing, canoeing and triathlon. The club also takes part in offshore races with boat crews. Swimming and water polo teams are trained daily at the Olympic Larnaca Swimming Pool at the Kition Athletic Center and sailing and canoekayaking teams are trained in the sea area in front of the club.


